# Set up a hidden option

1. Open Config Editor
2. Right-click and choose “New”
3. Click on the type you want to create
4. Enter an option name
5. Enter a value
6. Restart Thunderbird if needed




# Do not wrap in the Navigation Bar

Option: `maxmsgpane.default_wrap`


Type: boolean

Default value: true

You have 3 messages and read them by clicking on the next button on the Navigation Bar ...



Value = true



Value = false


# Maximize without message selection

Option: maxmsgpane.allow\_max\_wo\_selection


Type: boolean

Default value: false

This message is shown in the status bar if no message is selected on maximization.

**Value = true**

# Do not maximize by left-clicking on the header view

Option: maxmsgpane.forbid\_lmb\_on\_hdr

Type: boolean

Default value: false

Left mouse button and  
middle mouse button  
are available



Value = false

Only middle mouse  
button are available



If you use single-clicking to toggle, I recommend you to use this mode and use single-middle-clicking to avoid to conflict with some operations: selecting text, etc...

Value = true


# Hide Lightning's “Today Pane” on maximizing

Option: maxmsgpane.collapse\_Itntoday

Type: boolean


Default value: false

Today Pane is not hidden



Value = false

Today Pane is hidden too.



Value = true
